

While a part of the Kevin Barry's, Paddy sat on the Philadelphia GAA Board for numerous years, serving as Chairperson and Secretary.

Once Paddy and many other colleagues began starting their families, they realized a need for a youth GAA team was needed. Paddy and the other founding members created the Delaware County Gaels Youth GAA organization. Paddy served as the chairperson and vice-chairperson for numerous years for the Delco Gaels.

While apart of the Delco Gaels, Paddy set his eyes on the USGAA County Board. He served as the secretary of the USGAA County Board for a couple of years and then was elected as Chairperson of the USGAA County Board.

Paddy continues to support all GAA clubs in Philadelphia. Since his involvement in the GAA, both in Philly and the USGAA, he turned his attention to benefits and helping out the Irish Community of Philadelphia. Paddy is involved in the Charlie Dunlop Memorial Fund and the Philadelphia Irish Golf Charities.

John continued to be involved with the GAA here in Philadelphia, first being involved with the Cavan Football Club. Most of John's time here has been spent being involved with the Young Irelands Club. John also spent three years as registrar of the Philadelphia GAA Board.

While there was a fair amount of GAA football in Philadelphia for many years, there was no underage team. John was approached about helping to start a team and joined the first committee. As far as John can remember, the first training took place at the Cardington Recreation Field behind 69th Street in Upper Darby. While there was a good turn out on that first day, few could foresee what the Delaware County Gaels would become today. John considers his part in the story of the Delco Gaels as a small one, and it is really all those men and women through the years since who have built the club into the success it is today, providing the opportunity for young people to play Gaelic Games here in Philadelphia.



FRANKIE MCNICHOLL

Frankie was born in Gortnagh, Dungiven Co. Derry married to John McNicholl from Glenullin Co.Derry. They have three wonderful children, Sean, Conall and Aine. She followed GAA from a young age with brothers playing football and herself and her sisters playing camogie.

Frankie went to the USA in June 1984 and settled in Boston and then moved to Philadelphia in 1987. She didn't get involved with GAA here in Philadelphia until their kids started playing.

She is very proud to have been one of the founding members of this club which developed in to great club thanks to all the individuals involved now.

TOM COYLE

Tom was born in Ballymachugh, Co. Cavan. His love for the game started in Ballynarry National School, where he was Captain of the boys team. He continued to play football during his years at Granard Technical School in Co. Longford. After finishing school, Tom decided to see the works. He made the long journey of 20 miles to Castlepollard Co. Westmeath to find work, there was no Gaelic football in Castlepollard, Tom started playing hurling and like all his other endeavours in life, he became quite successful with the hurl winning three junior county championship medals, in 1960, 61 and 62. While looking around Tom decided the world did not end in Westmeath so he set out for Port Talbot in Wales, while there he helped start a Gaelic football team.

While working in Wales Tom met his wife Marie. While again looking around one day Tom decided Wales was not the end of the world either. In 1972 he headed for Philadelphia and Marie arrived here shortly after. Tom and Marie returned home in 1974 to get married and in 1979 had a daughter Bridget.

Since his arrival in the US Tom had been an active member of the GAA as a player, organiser and referee. In 1973, he had won a junior championship and junior b championship in 1982 with Cavan.

Tom was elected vice president of the Philadelphia GAA board in 1976. The Cavan football club elected him president in 1976, 1977 and 1983. He was also Philadelphia man of the year in 1983. Tom was a proud Cavan club man until the club folded in 1997. Tom's interests are not entirely confined to GAA however he was an active member of the Cavan Society and was vice president in 1976 and 1977 and president in 1979.

Tom was actively involved with the camogie in the city of Philadelphia since its inception, and has held the office of manager, trainer and coach of various teams. He was a much sought after camogie referee here in Philadelphia. Tom was very active in pushing the youth of Philadelphia to try Gaelic sports. Tom also worked very hard to get a minor league going, but unfortunately to no avail. As the twilight sets in around his athletic career. He also played some different sports in his spare time aside from football. One of them was dart throwing, where he became one of the top throwers in the Philadelphia league. He also played a bit of golf.

In 2002, Tom and Marie made their way home to Bailieborough Co. Cavan. Sadly in March of 2008 Tom passed away. His legacy does live on, his 3 granddaughter's are all involved in the GAA at home in Derry. Tom's family here in Philadelphia were all at one time active members in the Philadelphia GAA, his daughter Bridget played for the Emerald Eagles before her move home to Derry. His eldest granddaughter Mary, was a sanctioned player this year in Philadelphia playing for the Notre Dames and Na Toraidhe, a true full circle moment for the family.

His family is delighted to have his legacy and commitment to the GAA honored tonight.



GERALDINE NICHOLAS

Geraldine, originally from Dungiven in County Derry, grew up in a household where Gaelic sports were a big part of family life. She played camogie when she was a young girl, and her love for Gaelic sports continued when she moved to the USA in 1986, where she supported the local Philadelphia GAA teams.

When she realized there was no youth program for kids to get involved, Geraldine and her co-founders took action and created the Delaware County Gaels. They aimed to introduce as many kids as possible, including her son and daughter, to the sport and spread the word about this exciting opportunity.

She's proud of the part she played in getting the youth program off the ground and is thankful for everyone who has contributed to its growth.

Geraldine is deeply committed to preserving Irish culture in the United States. A special moment for her was watching the Delaware County Gaels play at the GAA World Games in 2022 in Derry.

She is a loving grandmother, eager to one day take her five grandchildren to Ireland to share her love for both the culture and the sport.
